Changing the World by the Spirit

Introduction

In watching the US Olympic Volleyball team, it's interesting to watch the middle and outside hitters. These positions always make their run as if they are going to hit the ball. They jump every time in case the setter decides to come their way. They don't know if they'll be rewarded for their effort but make the run no matter the result. These people must rely on the setter to decide when and where to use them.

Obviously, like with any metaphor, this isn't perfect, but we are asked to be ready when it comes to Jesus' return. Jesus could come back at any time, and we need to be faithful to do what God has asked us to do. We are not to idly wait. We are called to share our faith, to take care of the poor and oppressed. We are to be the hands and feet of Jesus.

It's incredible to think that those we read about in the Bible had the same responsibility to share and to meet as Christians. If they had not heeded the call, we might not have the faith base we experience today. So, what will you do with your responsibility, and how does God say He will help us with this mission?

What does the passage mean?		
1.	Verse three mentions that Jesus presented himself and gave many convincing proofs He was alive. What proof did He give? (John 20:26-27; 1 Corinthians 15:5-8)	
2.	What stipulations did they have to meet to become an apostle? (Acts 1:21-22) Why was this necessary?	
3.	What is the promise of the Father as referenced in verse four? (John 14:15-21)	

4.	How is Jesus going to come the second time?

5. Verse 7 says we are not to know the time or date of Jesus' second coming. How are we to live in the meantime? (Matthew 24:42, 44; 25:13; Luke 12:40)

Applying the passage

2. Jesus promised that the Spirit would fill us and sustain us. It's as if we always have Jesus with us, teaching, correcting, and changing us. How do you rely on the Spirit in your daily activities? What else could you do to be aware of the Spirit's work in your life?

3. Jesus taught His disciples many things during His earthly ministry, yet much of it was still a mystery to them until God opened their eyes by giving them the Holy Spirit. So, ask God today to open your eyes. Ask Him for a better understanding of His word and what He wants to tell you. Write a prayer below to reflect that.
