Cultivating a Fantastic Marriage

INTRODUCTION

3.	What was man's response to meeting his companion for the first time? (Genesis 2:23)
4.	What happens when man and wife are united? (Genesis 2:24)
5.	What do we have if we don't have love? (1 Corinthians 13:1-3)

INTERPRETATION: What do the passages mean?

1. What is the purpose of marriage? (Genesis 2:18; Ecclesiastes 4:9-12; Matthew 19:6; 1 Corinthians 11:11-12)

2. In what ways is marriage a reflection of our relationship with God? (Genesis 1:26-27; John 13:35; 1 Corinthians 13:4-5; Ephesians 5:22-27)

3. How should we treat our spouses? (Matthew 6:14-15; John 15:12; Ephesians 4:32; 1 Corinthians 16:14; Colossians 3:12-14)

4.	What steps can we take to cultivate a strong marriage?
