How to Multiply Volunteers

Introduction

Have you ever had to recruit and organize a team of volunteers at church? The process often goes like this:

- Explain the need for volunteers for an upcoming event
- Explain how people can volunteer
- Ask for volunteers to step forward
- Ask individuals who they think could be a good fit
- Ask your friends and family to help with unfilled jobs
- Find more volunteers to cover last-minute cancellations
- · Run around and solve problems that occur

To find enough people willing to volunteer, church leaders are often left taking anyone who shows the slightest interest in helping. If they are willing, they are good volunteers. But those that volunteer may not be the best suited to the task at hand. What they are being asked to do may not be part of their God-given gifts, resulting in problems. Or the same people are asked to volunteer at every event in the church, which can lead to resentment, frustration, and fatigue. In the end, to prevent these problems from arising, the church leaders step in and take on volunteer roles to fill the need instead of serving the church body according to their spiritual gifts.
