Status...in a Relationship

Introduction

Abraham trusted God fully. When asked to leave his homeland and enter into Canaan, he trusted God. When asked to sacrifice Isaac, Abraham trusted that God knew what He was doing. So, when it was time to find Isaac a wife, Abraham knew that he needed to trust God to provide the right woman for his son. Abraham is a good example of how we should trust God in all aspects of our life, including our relationships.

Abraham looked to God to bring the right wife to Isaac. And like Abraham, we need to look to God for guidance in our relationships too. But, more importantly, Abraham put God first. He relied on God, he trusted God, and he had complete confidence that God would fulfill the promises He made.

What does the passage mean?

1. Abraham trusted God would be faithful to His promise (Genesis 24:7). What does God promise us? (Matthew 6:33; John 3:16; 2 Corinthians 1:20-22; Hebrews 4:16)

2. Why can we be confident that God will fulfill His promises to us? (Numbers 23:19; Isaiah 43:2; Philippians 4:19; James 1:5)

3. Abraham served God faithfully—regardless of how farfetched the command God was giving him. What attributes of servanthood does Abraham show? (Deuteronomy 6:5; Psalm 118:1; 1 Thessalonians 2:4; 2 John 6)

4. Abraham and his servant trusted God to provide a spouse for Isaac. How do we know that we can trust God to provide for us? (Matthew 7:9-11; Mark 11:24; Luke 11:9-10; 1 John 5:14)

5. Abraham knew how important it was for Isaac to be married to someone who shared the same faith in God. Why is it important for us to trust God to lead us to the right person or to be content with being single? (Jeremiah 29:11-13; Proverbs 3:5-6; Romans 8:28)

Applying the passage

1. Do you struggle with trusting God to provide? What keeps you from trusting God to meet your needs? What keeps you from being content with what you have? Write a prayer giving those areas of struggle to God.

2. What effects have you seen in yours or other's lives when they did not trust God and took matters into their own hands rather than waiting on God to work?

3. List some ways that you have seen God provide for you in your life. Write out a prayer of thankfulness to Him below for those things. Use these to remind yourself in times of worry and stress that God is faithful and provides for His people.
