### **Honest Giving**

#### Introduction

The idea of money and giving can be an extremely touchy subject in churches. Unfortunately, churches can sometimes become known more for their constant pleas for money rather than the gospel of Jesus Christ.

The standard given for our story this week is about voluntary and generous contributions so that nobody in the church community was in need. It was not about a compulsive or forced redistribution to become a member of the church. Instead, it was a movement of the Holy Spirit working through people to be generous.

Unfortunately, selfish people usually lurk behind to try and take advantage of people whenever good things are happening, like at the beginning of this story. That is what we are going to see in our story this week: a married couple conspiring to look more spiritual and generous than they were and attempting to deceive the Holy Spirit.

What does it mean to take care of those in need in our church community? How do we go about it in the best way possible to honor God and take care of people?

Pray and read Acts 4:32-5:11. What questions or observations do you have about this passage?

## What does the passage say?

1.	How were the believers acting toward each other? (Acts 4:32)
2.	What was happening in the church? (Acts 4:33-35)
3.	What did Ananias do with his property? (Acts 5:1-2)
4.	What did Peter say to Ananias about his dishonesty? (Acts 5:3-4)
5.	What happened to Ananias because of his dishonesty? (Acts 5:5)
6.	What did Ananias' wife, Sapphira, do? (Acts 5:7-8)
7.	What did Peter say to her? (Acts 5:9)
8.	What seized the people who heard about these events? (Acts 5:11)

### What does the passage mean?

Could Ananias and Sapphira have been honest about the terms of their property sale with the apostles? Why? (Deuteronomy 16:17; Acts 2:45, 4:34-37; 2 Corinthians 9:7; 1 Timothy 6:17-19)

2. What was their reason for lying about the terms of the sale? (Matthew 6:1, 7:15, 23:5; 2 Timothy 3:5)

3. What are the right reasons to give to those in need? (Proverbs 3:27, 19:17; Romans 12:13; Hebrews 13:16)

4.	Ananias and Sapphira sought human praise and
	admiration for their generous gift rather than doing it
	for the right reasons. How should we go about giving for
	the right reasons? (Matthew 6:2-4; 1 Corinthians 13:3; 2
	Corinthians 9:7; Colossians 3:23-24)

5. Why did they believe they could hide their sin from the Holy Spirit and the church? (Numbers 32:23; Psalm 44:21, 139:1-6; Hebrews 4:13)

### Applying the passage

1. What are some ways you have tried to hide your sin from God but recognize it is time to come out into the open to confess it?

2. What have been some of your reasons for giving generously in the past? Have they matched up with Scripture or been more focused on what you get from giving?

3. The early church did very well at taking care of the needs of others within their community. So, who are some people in our church community who you know need some help, love, and care? How can you show care and generosity to them?
